
#### **Sport Premium Funding**

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#### Curriculum:

The children at Penryn Junior children will continue to take part in 2 hours P.E. per week alongside 1 hours weekly of swimming per year group per year.

Penryn Junior School, alongside all other Penryn Partnership Schools, sent 3 teachers on Real P.E. training. From the summer term, the Real PE scheme will become our new whole school scheme of work. The training and resources will support teachers in delivering PE from Foundation stage to Key stage 2. The Real PE scheme focuses on the development of agility, balance and co-ordination, healthy competition and co-operative learning.

Penryn Junior School have also entered Penryn Partnership Swim gala. The cross country event was incredibly successful with 7 children qualifying from the first round to the Peninsula stage. One child went on to win the overall event and is currently the fastest under 11 girl in Cornwall. A team of 18 children from the Junior School entered into the indoor athletics competition, after the first event the children qualified for the Peninsula stage of the event. We also entered teams into a cricket festival and to a grass track cycling event.
