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Topic coverage (this may change during the term)

English

- We will be learning spellings through Read Write Inc.
- We will be developing our reading strategies to answer comprehension questions.
- We will be covering Smok the Dragon through Pie Corbett storytelling focussing on adjectives, adverbs and creative writing.

Mathematics

Fractions

Solve problems involving increasingly harder fractions to calculate quantities, and fractions to divide quantities

Decimals

Recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number of tenths or hundredths.

Find the effect of dividing a one or two digit number by 10 or 100, identifying the value of the digits in the answer as ones, tenths and hundredths

Solve simple measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals to two decimal places.

Convert between different units of measure [for example, kilometre to metre]

History/Geography

- Anglo Saxons and Scots
 (Britain's settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Scots)
- Vikings and Anglo Saxons
 (The Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor)
- Locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia) concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries, and major cities
- Human geography, including: types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water
