Rationale

A culture where children's good choices are rewarded with freedom.

Where clear consequences are applied consistently and rewards and sanctions progress accordingly.

Empowering children through them being independent and taking responsibility.

Empowering all staff to apply a single policy across both sites with age appropriate approaches.

This year all of our staff will be looking for:

- 1. Walking on the left in corridors
- 2. Children wearing the correct uniform: black shoes and a red jumper
- 3. Coming in to assembly correctly
- 4. Walking in from the playground






