
The Primary School Sport Premium is new government funding given directly to individual Primary Schools to improve PE and Sport Provision. This year our school will receive

All Penryn Partnership Primary Schools have agreed to spend £3,000 per year per for academic years: 2013/14, 2014/15,2015/16, to work closely with **Penryn College** in developing the following key areas:

'Sport Premium': £8,000 per school per year + £5 per pupil for 2 years.

Our Primary School, alongside all other Penryn Partnership Schools, sent 3 teachers on Real P.E. training. This will become our new whole school scheme of work in the Autumn Term. The training and resources will support teachers in delivering PE from Foundation stage to Key stage 2. It focuses on the development of agility, balance and co-ordination, healthy competition and co-operative learning.

Remaining Budget

We have received £8,035 so far and this is how we've spent it:

The remaining budget will be spent on hiring more coaches/paying Teaching Assistants to increase our out of school clubs provision, re-training our swimming teachers, equipment and INSET for teachers.

The Impact the school has seen on pupils' PE and Sport participation and attainment

Penryn Partnership:

This year our links with Penryn College have once again enabled all children to access the college facilities, with Key Stage 1 using the TISA weekly, and use of other facilities when needed.

All Key Stage 1 children have had access to the colleges Young Sports Leaders:

70 Year 1 children worked with Young Leaders for 5 hours over 5 weeks

60 Year 2 children worked with Young Leaders for 2 hours over 4 weeks

25 Pupil Premium and vulnerable children worked with Penryn Junior Young Leaders for 1 afternoon.

Professional Development opportunities have been organised through the sports partnership:

3 teachers have received 3 days training each on the new Curriculum

All Key stage 1 teachers have had the opportunity to watch a Real P.E. lesson delivered by Angela Walker with Early Years opportunities planned.

Claire Brittain has attended termly PLT meetings organised by the sports partnership and has received support from Angela Walker in her role as co-ordinator.

1 teacher attended a Change 4 Life workshop which targets Pupil Premium and less active children and equipment for this has been borrowed from the sports partnership.

Competition

Inter-school competition has been organised by the sports partnership:

20 Year 2 children attended a Key Stage 1 Mini Olympics

6 Key Stage 1 children with SEN attended an inclusion Festival

Curriculum:

Our children continue to take part in 2 hours P.E. per week which includes a 10 week block of swimming per year group per year.

Some teachers have been delivering Real P.E. lessons in preparation for September when this curriculum will be taken on by Key Stage 1 and Reception.

After-School Provision:

In response to last year's Pupil/Parent questionnaire for P.E. an attempt has been made to increase provision based on what the children wanted as a result:

46 children have accessed Cheernastics

25 children have accessed Football

22 children have accessed Golf
